## Purpose

This condition is used for showing a transition only to those users **NOT in a field**. This condition supports any **User** or **Multi-User** field or custom field.

Also **text fields** can be used. In these cases it's expected that fields contain the **name of a user** or a **comma separated list of user names**. Don't confuse **user name** with **users's full name**.

## Example: Prevent last user that commented the issue from seeing a transition

Except user in field:	<div>Last commenter - [User]</div> <div>Fields different from <i>User Picker</i>, <i>Multi-User Picker</i>, <i>Group Picker</i> or <i>Multi-Group Picker</i>, are expected to contain the <b>name of a user</b> (not to be confused with user's full name).</div>
<div>Add Cancel</div>	

Once configured, condition will look like this:

Triggers 0	Conditions 1	Validators 1	Post Functions 8
------------	--------------	--------------	------------------

All of the following conditions

Add condition

User in field **Last commenter** is not allowed to see or execute current transition.
