| Valid text input | A comma-separated list of usernames, group names or project roles names  |
| Valid numerical input | |
| Example input | username1, username2, username3 |

Sets the watchers of an issue **replacing** existing watchers! If you just want to add new watchers, see [New watchers](#).

Prefixes + and - can be used to **add** or **remove** watchers.

| Input | Description |
|--|---|
| Albert, Richard, John | Replaces the current watchers with users Albert, Richard and John . |
| + Developers, Administrators | Adds every user in project roles or groups Developers and Administrators as current watchers. |
| - Testers, Administrators, + Albert, Richard | Removes users in project roles or groups Testers and Administrators, and adds users Albert and Richard as watchers. |

Use this field to add or remove watchers to **linked issues, sub-tasks** or issues returned by **JQL**.
