filterByResolution(issueList, resolutions) #Output: Issue list

<pre>%{filterByResolution(subtasks(), "Won't Fix, Cancelled")}</pre>	This example returns the issue list of sub-tasks with resolutions Won't Fix or Canc elled . To achieve this, the following functions are used: • subtasks()
<pre>%{filterByResolution(linkedIssues(), "")}</pre>	This example returns an issue list with all unresolved linked issues. To achieve this, the following functions are used: • linkedlssues()
<pre>%{filterByResolution(linkedIssues(), resolution(10000))}</pre>	This example returns an issue list with all linked issue that have the resolution with id 10000 set. The function resolution() resolves the provided ID and parses the resolution name.
	This way the function will still work even if the resolution name might change at some point.
<pre>filterByResolution (siblingIssuesUnderEpic(), %{issue. resolution})</pre>	This example returns an issue list with all siblings of the same epic that have the same resolution like the current issue . To achieve this, the following functions are used: • siblingIssuesUnderEpic()
